What do you think it looks like to enter in–even with strong convictions—while maintaining a critical distance? In other words, to use Pastor Curtis's phrase, what does it take to be "a kingdom-independent"?
- 5. As followers of Christ and members of God's kingdom, what might we all affirm about the values/instincts of conservatives/Republicans? How about the values/instincts of liberals/Democrats? In what ways does the kingdom of God stand in opposition to both of these ideologies/parties?
- 6. How do you sense the Lord calling you to respond on the day that the election results are announced?
- 7. What are you praying for our church in these upcoming weeks and months?
